RULES OF DECORUM FOR ASSOCIATION

1. A Moderator and Clerk chosen by the suffrages of the members present.
2. The Moderator shall take the chair at the hour to which the Association shall be convened, and after prayer shall proceed to business. It shall be his duty to keep order, and be entitled to the privilege of speech as that of other members, provided he appoints someone of the members to fill the chair during the exercises of such privilege, and in no case shall he give a vote unless the Association be equally divided.
3. Only one member shall be allowed to speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator. He shall strictly adhere to the subject of debate, and in no wise reflect on the person who preceded him, by making remarks on his observation.
4. No person shall speak more than three times on any one subject without leave obtained from the association.
5. No person shall absent himself from the Association without obtaining leave therefrom.
6. No member of the Association shall address another by any form or appellation than Brother.
7. The Moderator shall not interfere with a member or prohibit him from speaking until his speech is finished unless he violates the rules of decorum.
8. The names of all members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called as often as the Association may require.
9. Any member who shall willingly and knowingly violate any of the foregoing rules, shall be reprovved by the Association in any way it may think proper.

HISTORY OF UNITED BAPTIST

The Bible teaches us that Jesus established His Church during His Ministry.

The Baptist in the year of 1638 were coming to the colonies from England, Wales and other places and by the Grace of God, help from the Holy Spirit and the desire to take the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the new world. They preached the Gospel of Jesus Christ and planted Baptist Churches.

In the year of 1707, six Baptist Churches organized the first Association in America and named it the Philadelphia Baptist Association.

Because of adverse laws and persecutions Baptist remained few in number, yet by the year of 1740 their churches numbered 40. In the years of 1737, 1738, 1739 and 1740 the colonies were visited by Minister, George Whitfield from England who conducted revival meetings with great success.

In 1740 the Baptist Church at Boston, Massachusetts found fault with the methods used in the above said revival. This friction ended in a division of the church in the year 1742.

The parties adopted Regular and Separate Baptist for their names.

Both parties were mission minded and churches of both names were planted. In all the colonies both groups could trace their footsteps to the Philadelphia Association, the English, and Wales Churches, and to the church that Jesus organized.

After three years of prayer and consultation six Associations met in August 10, 1787 at Dover Church in Goochland County, Virginia and agreed to bury the names of Regular and Separate in oblivion (a forgetting) and to be known as the United Baptist Churches of Jesus Christ.

United Baptist began coming to Missouri in the year of 1790 and by God's help and their mission efforts churches have been planted over the entire state.

On Saturday before the second Lord's Day in June 1816, a convention was held at Bethel meeting house to begin the organization of an Association of Churches. This meeting was held at Bethel Church near Jackson, Missouri that was organized July 19, 1806. This was the first permanent Baptist Church in the Missouri Territory.

The three churches that were constituted were to send messengers and letters to the Little River Association and request a letter of dismissing from that Association to form one in Missouri, to be called Bethel Association.

Time was given to constitute and ordain the officers of the churches, and to meet again on Saturday before the last Lord's Day in September. Seven churches formed the first Association. Bethel Church near Jackson, Tywaepity Church south of Cape Girardeau, Providence Church at

Fredericktown, Barren Church in Perry County, Belleview Church at Caledonia, St. François Church twenty five miles below the village of St. Michaels now called Fredericktown near St. Francois River, Dry Creek Church in Cape County.

The constitution of the Bethel Association drafted the same as the Virginia Union of Baptist.

The Bethel Association was organized on the principles of the United Baptist.

Bethel Association dismissed nine churches September 1859 for the purpose of organizing a new Association. These churches were Bethlehem, Mt. Pleasant, Big Creek, Sugar Tree Grove, Pleasant Grove, Mt. Zion, Mt. Gilead, Locust Grove, and White Oak Grove. These nine churches organized the Central Missouri Association of United Baptist in October 1859.

The Central Missouri Association took the same Constitution and Articles of Faith of the Bethel Association; our heritage from the Philadelphia Association of 1707; the Virginia Union of Baptist. This Association adopted the Red River Association Constitution so there is the Bethel Association. Central Missouri Association came from Bethel Association; Bethel Association came from Little River Association in Kentucky in 1813; Little River Association came from the Red River Association in Kentucky in 1813; Red River Association came from Cumberland River Association of Tennessee in 1806; Cumberland River Association came from the Mero District in 1802; Mero District from labors of ministers of the Elkhorn Association of Kentucky 1796; Elkhorn Association was gathered and formed by such men as Elder John Taylor, John Gano and A. Dudley who was connected with the Philadelphia Association. The Philadelphia Association the first Association in America.

We, are proud of our heritage. We, today are proud indeed of the spirit of brotherhood and good will that prevails among us and we believe that the power of God which enabled our forefathers to found this Baptist faith will lead us to meet the many problems of a changing world, and that this power will guide us in all things as we work out the fulfillment of God's divine will in this world.

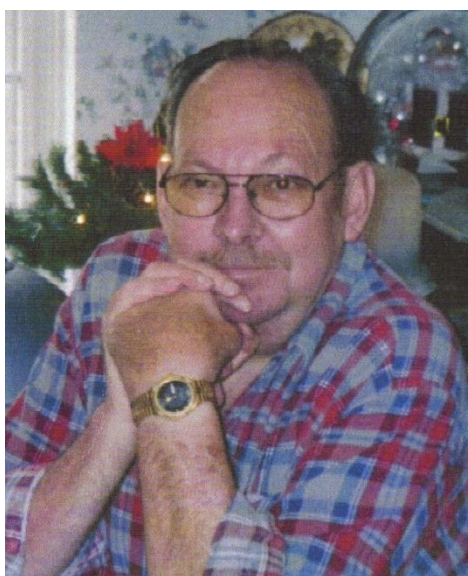

CHURCH COVENANT

We, the undersigned, being desirous of enjoying ourselves in the Lord and having all due knowledge of each other, in the point of works of grace on our heart, religious principle and moral character and being desirous to enjoy the privileges that appertain to the people of God; in a church relation, do, in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, freely give ourselves up to the Lord, and to one another, according to His word, to be one body and one head, to exist and act according to the bonds and order of the Gospel, and do promise and engage to do all things by Divine assistance in our several capacities and relations that the Lord has commanded and required of

us to deny ourselves, take up our Cross, follow Christ, keep the faith, assemble ourselves together, love the brethren, submit one to another, bear one another's burdens, endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bonds of peace.

This is the covenant we solemnly enter into in the fear of the Lord, humbly imploring His divine assistance and blessing that we may be built up and established to the glory of God and the advancement of the Redeemer's interests and comfort and edification of our own soul, through the infinite riches of Free Grace which is in Christ Jesus, our Lord.

And now to the King Eternal, Immortal and all-wise God, be worship, honor, and obedience rendered, now and evermore,----- Amen.

CONSTITUTION

From a long series of experiences, we, the United Baptist Churches of Jesus Christ, being regularly baptized upon the profession of our faith in Christ, are convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches in order to perpetuate union and communion among us and to preserve and maintain a correspondence with each other in our union. We, therefore, purpose to maintain and keep the orders and rules of an association, according to the following plan or form of government.

1st: The Association to be composed of the members duly chosen by the churches in our union, and sent to represent them in the Association who are to be members whom they may judge best qualified for that purpose, and producing letters from their respective churches certifying their appointments, are entitled to a seat.

2nd: The letters from the different churches to express their number in full fellowship – Increase: those baptized, received by letter, restoration, and recommendation. – Decrease: by death, letter, dismissed or excommunicated, since last Association.

3rd: The members thus chosen and convened to be denominated THE CENTRAL MISSOURI ASSOCIATION OF UNITED BAPTIST, being composed of sundry churches, who are to have no power to lord over God's heritages; nor are they to have classical power over the churches, nor to infringe on any of the internal rights of the churches in our union; nevertheless, it becomes necessary in some cases to have a uniform rule of proceeding; this is, in case where an offense may be committed either by an individual church, or an individual member of a church which affects any of the sister churches in the union, that the church or individual so offending may be brought to trial, and their case determined upon by the rules prescribed in the Gospel, referred to in Mathew XVIII, and other Scriptures concerning discipline for the bringing to trial and determining upon the case of an individual or and individual church.

4th: The Association, when convened, is to be governed and ruled by a proper decorum, which they are authorized to form for themselves.

5th: The Association to have a moderator and clerk who are to be chosen by suffrages of the members present.

6th: New churches may be admitted into this Association who are to petition by letter and delegate, and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly, may be received by the Association, and manifested by the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship.

7th: Every church in this union is entitled to representation in the Association.

8th: Every query presented by any church in the Association is to be read, and before it is debated the delegates from said church are to state or open the nature of the query to the Association; then the Moderator is to put

the vote, and if there be a majority for its being debated, it may be taken into consideration and be debated, but if a majority is against it, it is to be withdrawn.

N.B. – We advise the churches not to send any query to this Association but what has been debated in their own churches and cannot be determined upon with satisfaction.

9th: Every motion made and seconded is to come under the consideration of the Association except it be withdrawn by the member who made it.

10th: The Association is to furnish the churches with the minutes of the Association, the best method for effecting that purpose to be at the discretion of the future Associations.

11th: We think it is necessary that we should have an Association fund for defraying the expenses of the same: for the raising and supporting of which we think it the duty of the churches in the union to contribute such sums of money as they think proper and send by the hand of their delegates to the Association: and those moneys thus contributed by the churches are to be deposited into the hands of the Treasurer, by the Association appointed, who is to be accountable to the Association for all monies received by him and paid out according to the directions of the Association.

12th: The is to be an Association book kept where in the proceedings of every Association are to be regularly recorded by a secretary appointed by the Association, who may receive a compensation yearly.

13th: The minutes of the Association to be read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before Association arises.

14th: It is the business of the Association:

- I. To provide for the general union of the churches.
- II. To observe inviolably a chain of communion amongst the churches in order to attain the desired end. We think it most advisable that the churches be constituted by presbyteries from at least two churches in the union among whom there are at least two ordained ministers and that ministers be ordained by at least two ministers in the union who have the pastoral care of churches or who affiliate in the office of pastor.
- III. To give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; and if the church or churches to whom the Association gives such advice cannot receive it, they may send it back again to the next Association with their objections and it is to be reconsidered.
- IV. To inquire into the cause why the churches do not represent them selves in the Association.
- V. To appropriate those monies by the churches contributed for an Association fund to anything they may think proper.
- VI. To appoint any member of members by and with their consent to transact any business they may think necessary.
- VII. The Association has power to withdraw from any church in this union which may violate the rules of the Association, or deviate from the orthodox principles of religion, whose determination is to be by a majority of members present.
- VIII. To admit any of the distant Brethren in the ministry and assistants, who may be present at their sitting, whom they may judge qualified
- IX. This Association agrees to do all her business by a majority, except in the reception of churches but in that case by unanimous vote.
- X. The Association has power to adjourn to any future time and place they may think most convenient to the churches.
- XI. Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made at any time by a majority of the churches when they may think necessary.

15th: Resolutions Adopted:

- I. Adopted October 11, 1976: We resolve that there shall be no women ordained as ministers or deaconesses.
- II. Adopted October 11, 1976: We resolve that we take a firm stand against abortion.
- III. Adopted October 15, 1979: We resolve that our Association go on record as denouncing the doctrine of second works of grace. "Following regeneration and calling it the Baptism of the Holy Ghost, speaking in tongues as unsound doctrine." We advise any church endorsing such or having members as advocating such to purge out or risk losing their place in the Association.
- IV. Adopted October 15, 1979: We resolve that the churches of this Association call pastors from our own faith and order. If they have problems finding a pastor, they are to ask the Credentials Committee to help locate them a pastor.
- V. Adopted October 15, 1979: We resolve that we print in the Minutes the order of business of how to ordain ministers and deacons. Also the procedure of organizing churches.
- VI. Adopted October 15, 1979: We resolve that the Credentials Committee be selected on the following basis: One for a five(5) year term; one for a four (4) year term; one for a three (3) year term; one for a two (2) year term; one for a one (1) year term; with the moderator to automatically serve on the committee. Each year hereafter, one to be appointed to a five (5) year term.
- VII. Adopted October 9, 1989: We resolve that the churches in our Association abstain from the teaching of the Premillennialist views on the tribulation and the thousand year reign of Christ.
- VIII. Adopted October 15, 1990: The Bill of Arrangements as a permanent Bill of Arrangement.
- IX. Adopted October 11, 1993: We resolve that all business for 5th Sunday Meeting be done on Saturday.
- X. Adopted October 10, 1994: We resolve that our evening services start at 7:00 o'clock.
- XI. Adopted October 13, 1997: The Central Missouri Association of United Baptist is on record as being opposed to the using of oil to anointing the sick for spiritual reasons.
- XII. Adopted October 14, 2002: We resolve that the churches call for the Credentials Committee to examine all persons who are to be ordained as a deacon or minister.
- XIII. Adopted October 14, 2002: (1975 motion) We resolve the Association form a Credentials Committee of six, for the purpose of examining Ministers and Deacons of other faiths seeking membership in any of our churches,
- XIV. Adopted October 13, 2003: We resolve that none other than an ordained minister of our Association serve as Moderator or our quarterly meetings, or fifth Sunday meetings, or the annual Association.
- XV. Adopted October 11, 2004: We resolve that ministers need to preach at least 2 years after they announce their calling to preach before they are ordained.
- XVI. Adopted October 11, 2004: We resolve that ministers and deacons that are to be ordained must meet the qualifications in I Timothy chapter 3; Titus chapter 1: Romans chapter 7, verses 1 thru 5; I Corinthians chapter 7, verses 1 thru 11, and verse 17; St. Mathew chapter 5 verse 32; and chapter 19, verses 4 thru 9.
- XVII. Adopted October 10, 2011: We the Central Missouri Association of United Baptist go on record as being strongly opposed to homosexuality. Therefore we DO NOT extend the right hand of fellowship for membership to these individuals into our churches, except they repent and completely renounce the practice of homosexuality. Furthermore, if we have an individual in one of our churches who submits to this ungodly lifestyle, this individual must be excluded immediately. We do not allow any person who practices the homosexual lifestyle to fill our pulpits for any reason.

3. Man was created in a holy and happy condition, but by transgression fell from that state and became depraved, and as he was the covenant head of his posterity, they are all born in a state of sin, and unless born of the Spirit, continue dead in trespasses and sin, being destitute of real holiness and possessing enmity of heart against God.
 - a. Man was created in holy condition – Gen. 1:27 & 31; Eccl. 7:29

4. The Church makes a motion that Brother _____ deliver the candidate over to the presbytery for ordination. They proceed with the ordination.
5. Examination of candidate.
6. Vote to proceed or not proceed with the ordination. Presbytery may excuse themselves from the rest of the house before vote if so desired.
7. Ordination prayer.
8. Laying on of hands.
9. Charge given to candidate.
10. Presbytery makes motion to deliver the candidate back to the church and tell them we have found candidate worthy of his office.
11. The church makes a motion to receive the work of the presbytery.
12. The presbytery makes a motion to hear the reading of their minutes and adjourn.
13. The church makes a motion to hear the reading of the minutes and adjourn.
14. The pastor and church shakes hands with the candidate and presbytery as congratulations for their work and the candidate for his office.

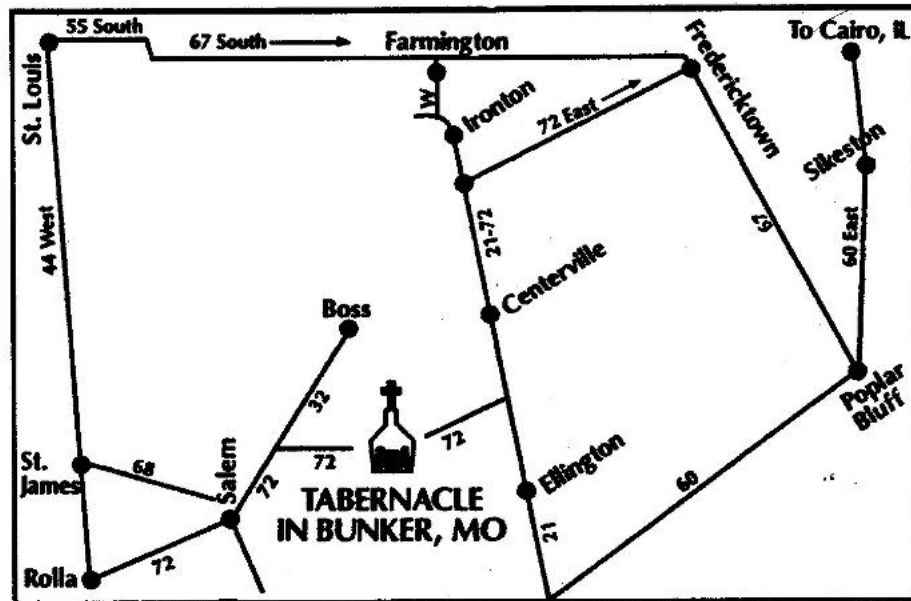

RULES OF DECORUM FOR CHURCHES

1. A Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by the church.
2. The church shall appoint on day in each month to regulate her concerns, at which time the Moderator shall proceed to keep order and take the voice of the church when necessary.
3. At which time he shall have the privilege of speech by calling on someone to fill his place; but in no case to vote except the church be tied.
4. The Clerk shall keep a just record of all business transacted by the church.
5. When the church is convened, conference shall be opened by prayer and the decorum read.
6. Visiting Brothers and Sisters shall be invited to a seat with us.
7. The peace of the church shall be called for.
8. A door shall be opened for the reception of members; all shall be received by unanimous vote; dismissed the same way.
9. Reference called for attended to in the following manner:
10. No private trespass shall be taken up by the church until the aggrieved have taken steps prescribed by the Gospel – referred, Matt. XVIII, and other Scriptures.
11. But in case of public sin there shall be a public acknowledgment.
12. Public reports that are abroad in the world injurious to the standing of a member shall be taken notice of – that is, he shall be caused to acknowledge or deny the same.
13. All other business by majority of the members present.
14. All business shall be taken by a motion. No motion shall be taken up but by second. Every motion seconded shall be attended to except withdrawn by the person who made it.
15. Every member offering a motion shall rise to his feet and address the Moderator by the title of Brother.
16. No one shall reflect on the speech of the one who proceeded him, but shall strictly adhere to the subject of debate.
17. No member shall absent himself or herself from the conference without the liberty of the church.
18. Male members missing more than three meetings shall tell the reasons why. The third meeting the church may send for them, if they think proper.
19. Females may fill their seats as often as convenient.
20. Minutes of the day may be read, amended by the church, if necessary, at the close of each day's business.
21. Amendments may be made to the decorum at any time it may be thought proper by the church.
22. The church shall convene itself from the rest of the house on each church meeting day.
